DET Health & Safety Guidelines Ontario Productions

Face Coverings:

Performers and Crew must wear face coverings:

- When directed by Ontario Public Health
- It is recommended that you wear a mask through Day 10 after exposure to a positive case
- It is recommended that you wear a mask on Day 6-through Day 10 after returning to work after a positive test

Health Screening:

- Performers or crew members exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms, shall not report to the workplace and must inform their immediate supervisor
- If performers or crew members begin exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms at the workplace, they shall report to their immediate supervisor
- Performers or crew members that test positive for COVID-19 shall remain home and report this to their immediate supervisor

Close Contacts:

If you were exposed to COVID-19:

- If you are asymptomatic, you are not required to self-isolate and you can continue to participate in routine activities, such as work
- If you are symptomatic, stay at home until you are well enough to participate in your usual activities
- Please refer to BC Public Health for any testing recommendations

Positive Cases:

If you test positive for COVID-19:

- Immediately submit <u>Positive Case Reporting Form</u> to the DET Contact Tracers
- Isolate for 5 days from start of symptoms or positive test (if asymptomatic)
- You may return to work on Day 6 if symptoms are improving and are fever free for 24-hours (without fever-reducing medication)
- No testing is required to return to work (after 5-day isolation) but if you test on your own and it is positive, you cannot work until a negative test or Day 11
- Wear a high-quality mask when indoors around others for 10 days
- We recommend masking through Day 10 unless you have two sequential negative tests taken 48-hours apart
