

# Firearms Talent Training Application

Live ammunition is prohibited from use on any scripted film or television productions. This Firearms Talent Training Application may be completed for training purposes on a controlled range only. In order to ensure timely review, the Production (producer) shall submit a completed Firearms Talent Training Application to the assigned Production Executive, Risk Management, and Production Safety along with a completed Firearms Hazard Assessment and proof of completion of necessary training.

## Instructions For Completing the Application

In order to be accepted for review and approval, the following information must be provided thoroughly and completely. The following will be the minimum information necessary to complete the application:

- Detailed description of proposed activity
- Justification for the use of live ammunition versus other methods (e.g. actor performance training).
- Names, contact information, credentials and/or certifications of the Trainers, Prop Master and Armorer who will be responsible for issuing, inspecting, handling and securing the firearms
- Names, titles, and contact information for all persons involved in the firearms training (including cast).
- Names and contact information for the intended Set Medic or other medical support that will be on site at all times during the proposed activity.
- Firing range information, including:
  - On-site Safety Protocols
  - Name and qualifications of Range Master
  - Site Address
  - Layout of facility where activity will take place, including any safety hazards identified and measures to be implemented to address those hazards
- Detailed inventory of firearms to be used (e.g., makes, models, and serial numbers)
- Detailed inventory of intended ammunition.

## Important Reminders

- Risk Management, Physical Production Executive and Production Safety Representative review prior to final approval by Senior Executives.
- All recommendations, special guidelines, and conditions for the safe handling of firearms utilizing "LIVE AMMUNITION" as listed in [Safety Bulletin #2: "Prohibitions and Special Restrictions On The Use Of Live Ammunition"](#) must be met.
- A preliminary [Firearms Hazard Assessment](#) must be completed (and used as a living document up to the date of the activity).
- In addition to training on the specific use of each firearm, training must include on-set safety protocols for prop firearm use.
