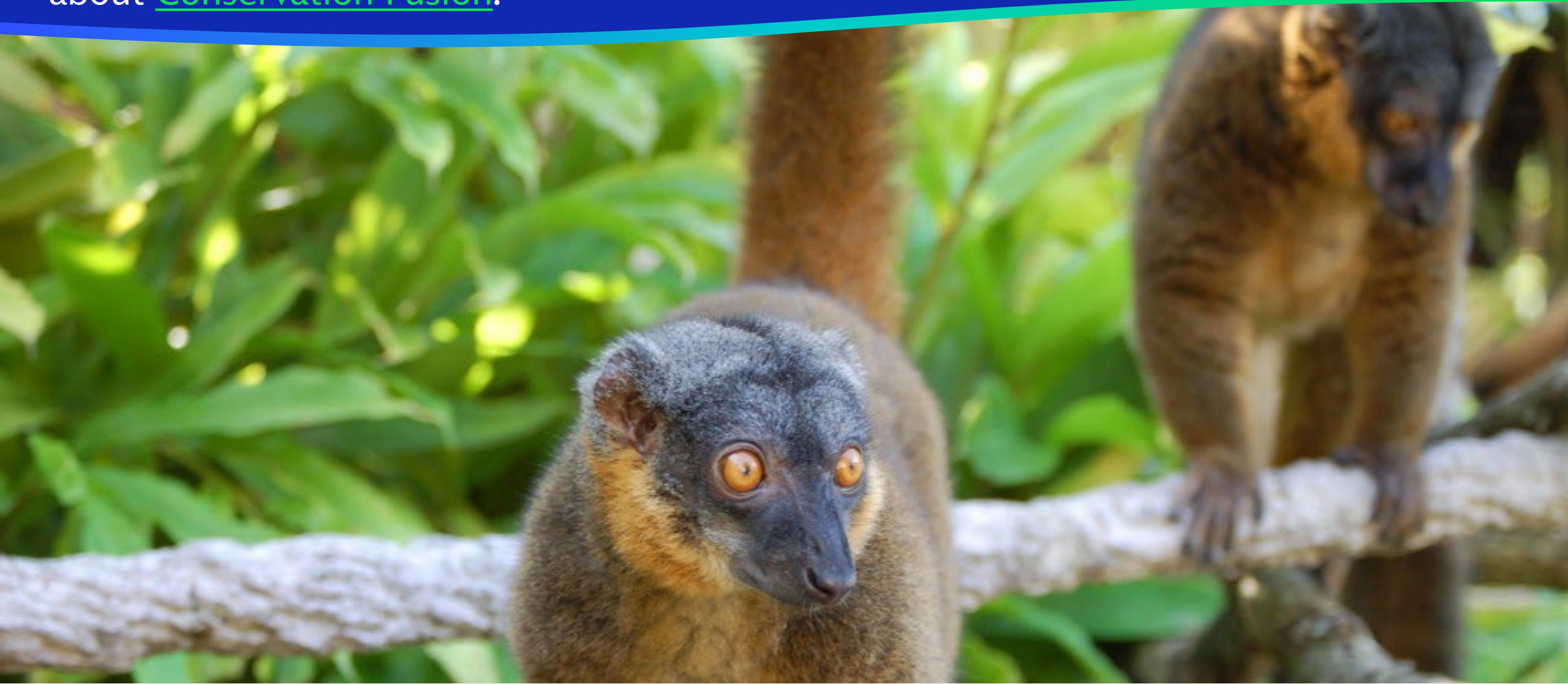
Disney has supported conservation organizations working to help protect all 5 species of rhino across more than 10 countries.

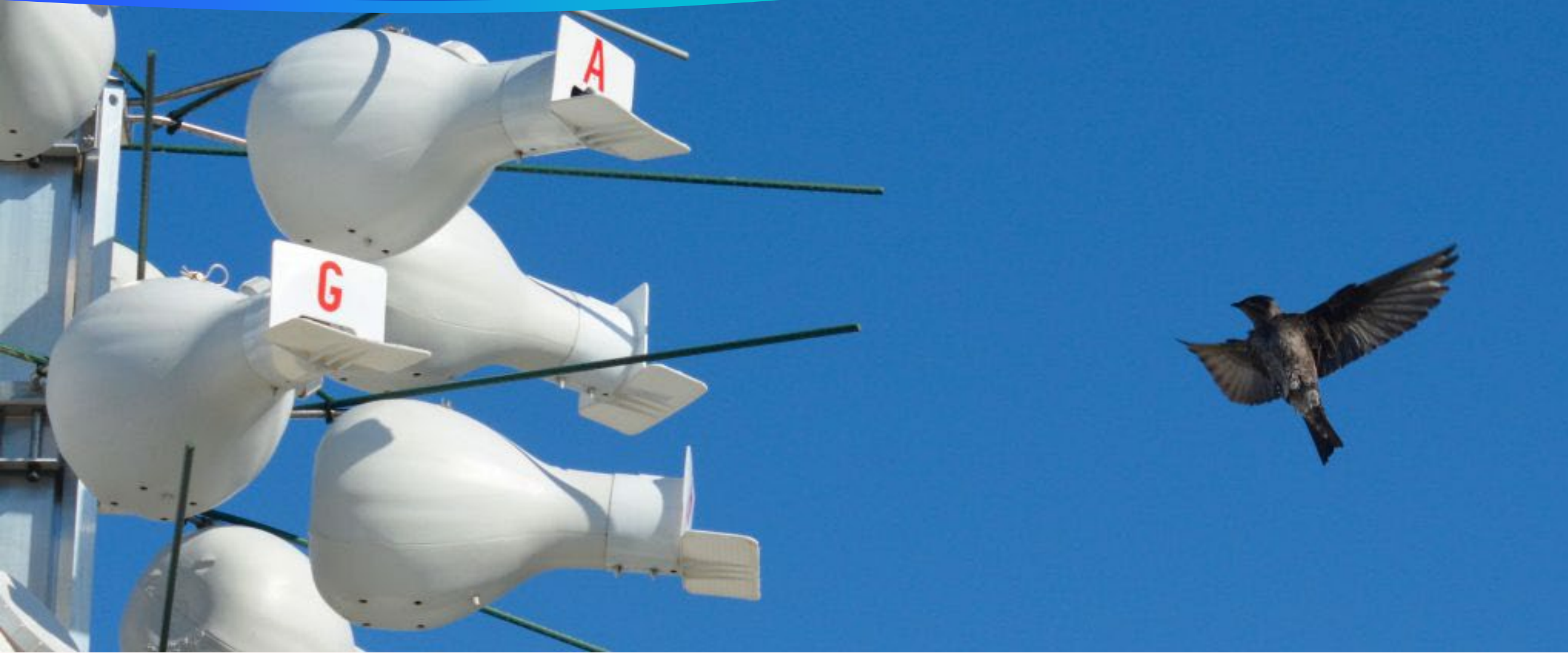
Disney has supported conservation work to protect 9 different species of gibbons and their habitats in Asia.
